AURORA MAN GETS PRISON FOR GUN, DRUG OFFENSE

An Aurora man is headed to prison for possessing a gun in close proximity to illegal drugs he planned to sell.

Kane County Circuit Judge Donald M. Tegeler, Jr., on Thursday, Feb. 22, 2018, sentenced 21-year-old **Angel Arredondo** to 10 years' imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

Judge Tegeler convicted Arredondo on the offense of armed violence, Class X felony, on August 7, 2017. Arredondo waived his right to a jury trial.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Matthew Rodgers presented evidence that on Feb. 11, 2016, Aurora police officers served a search warrant at Arredondo's residence in the 700 block of Spring Street, Aurora. Police found Arredondo in the basement in the residence with a loaded 12-gauge shotgun within his reach and more than 60 grams of marijuana that he admitted he sells.

The law prohibits the commission of any felony while armed with a firearm.

According to Illinois law, Arredondo is eligible for day-for-day sentencing. He receives credit for 205 days served in the Kane County jail.
