BOLINGBROOK MAN GUILTY OF BATTERY AFTER DRUGGING FEMALE ACQUAINTANCE

A Bolingbrook man has been convicted for drugging an acquaintance and attempting to remove her clothing.

Kane County Associate Judge Christine Downs on Wednesday, April 25, 2018, convicted 30-year-old **Karlos L. Ingram** of battery, Class A misdemeanor.

Ingram waived his right to a jury trial.

Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Hillary Sadler presented evidence during the trial that the evening of Dec. 19, 2016, Ingram met socially with the victim, whom he knew. Later that night they agreed to continue their conversation at the victim's St. Charles residence. At her home, the victim began to feel tired and decided to lie down. After the victim fell asleep, Ingram climbed on top of her, tried to undress her and kissed her. The victim regained consciousness, pushed Ingram off of her and told him to leave her home. She later went to police and submitted to chemical testing believing that Ingram had intentionally drugged her to make her lose consciousness. The chemical test revealed the presence of gamma-Hydroxybutyric acid (GHB), which often is referred to as a date-rape drug.

Upon finding Ingram guilty of the offense of battery, Judge Downs sentenced him to 18 months' of conditional discharge, ordered him to undergo a sex offender evaluation and a drug and alcohol evaluation, to follow all recommendations of the evaluations, and prohibited him from having any contact with the victim.
