TWO CARPENTERSVILLE MEN CHARGED AFTER DRUG BUST

November 9, 2018

Two Carpentersville men face criminal charges – one for multiple drug and gun offenses – after police served a search warrant, prompting one of the men to eat cocaine in an attempt to destroy evidence.

Kane County State's Attorney Joe McMahon has charged 51-year-old **Lamelle T. Johnson** with one count each of the offenses of:

- Armed violence, Class X felony
- Unlawful possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver, Class X felony
- Unlawful possession of a controlled substance, Class 1 felony
- Obstructing justice by destroying evidence, Class 4 felony
- Unlawful possession of a controlled substance, Class 4 felony
- Aggravated unlawful use of a weapon, Class 4 felony
- Resisting a police officer, Class A misdemeanor
- Possession of a firearm without a FOID card, Class A misdemeanor

In addition, State's Attorney McMahon charged 30-year-old **James M. Glover** with the offense of:

- Possession of a firearm while on parole, Class 2 felony

Kane County prosecutors and Carpentersville Police Chief Michael Kilbourne allege in charging documents that at about 4:45 p.m. Nov. 2, 2018, Carpentersville police served a search warrant at Johnson's residence in the 1100 block of Chippewa Circle. When officers entered the residence they found more than 15 grams but less than 100 grams of cocaine that Johnson sought to deliver to another, 25 hydrocodone pills, a stolen Smith & Wesson 9mm handgun that was in close proximity to the cocaine, and ammunition for the gun. Johnson does not possess a Firearm Owners Identification Card. Johnson was attempting to eat the cocaine when officers found him inside the residence. Johnson then refused to cooperate with police as they tried to place him under arrest. Glover, who was on parole from a 2011 felony case, was in possession of a stolen Glock 17 handgun when police found him inside the residence.

Johnson's next court appearance is set for 9 a.m. Nov. 14, 2018, in front of Circuit Judge John A. Barsanti in Courtroom 319 at the Kane County Judicial Center. He remains in the Kane County jail in lieu of \$750,000 bail.

Glover's next court appearance is set for 9 a.m. Nov. 14, 2018, in front of Circuit Judge Clint Hull in Courtroom 305 at the Kane County Judicial Center. He remains in the Kane County jail in lieu of \$750,000 bail.

The charges against Johnson and Glover are not proof of guilt. Johnson and Glover are presumed innocent and are entitled to a fair trial in which it is the state's burden to prove their guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.

James M. Glover: Age 30 (d.o.b. 12-26-1987), of the 1200 block of Navajo Circle, Carpentersville, Ill.
