FORMER CARPENTERSVILLE TEACHER GETS 10 YEARS FOR SEXUALLY ASSAULTING STUDENTS

January 31, 2020

A former Community Unit School District 300 teacher has been sent to prison for sexually assaulting two minors she knew.

Kane County Circuit Judge Donald M. Tegeler, Jr., today sentenced 31-year-old **Lindsey P. Anderson** to 10 years of imprisonment in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

Anderson on Sept. 13, 2019, pleaded guilty to the offenses of:

- Criminal sexual assault, Class 1 felony
- Aggravated criminal sexual abuse, Class 2 felony

Kane County Assistant State's Attorney Lori Schmidt stated that between July 2013 and May 2015 Anderson sexually assaulted the two victims. Anderson knew both victims, who were younger than 18 years old. Anderson at the time was employed at Carpentersville Middle School and worked as a coach at Dundee-Crown High School. Anderson took advantage of her prior relationship with the victims as their teacher. She was not their teacher when the crimes took place.

The sentence is four years for the Class 1 felony and six years for the Class 2 felony. According to Illinois law, Anderson must serve at least 85 percent of the sentence for the Class 1 felony, and she receives day-for-day credit for the Class 2 felony.

In addition, Anderson must register for life as a sexual offender in accordance with the Illinois Sexual Offender Registration Act.

Anderson receives credit for 2 days served in the Kane County jail. She had been free on \$10,000 bond.
